A Message from the Pastor:

"WE WERE NEVER MEANT TO BE SELF-FOCUSED LITTLE KINGS RULING MINISCULE LITTLE KINGDOMS WITH A POPULATION OF ONE." - Paul Tripp

This quote is actually the main theme of Paul Tripp's book, A Quest for More. This is one my favorite books that he has written, and I want to recommend it to you all. Over the past ten years or so, most of us have seen the super hero movies that have come out. We may have seen The Hobbit movies or Harry Potter. We've probably watched the Lord of the Rings series and all of the Star Wars movies. All of these movies have huge followings.

Partially, because they're really enjoyable films, but one of the biggest reasons that people love these kinds of movies, is that they sweep you up into a bigger world, with a bigger purpose. All of these characters are part of these world, or even, universe shaping missions, and their daily decisions and their daily actions matter.

We're so drawn to these characters, because that's not where most of us live. Luke Skywalker is off learning how to be a Jedi, and I'm in my cubicle working on a spreadsheet. It just doesn't feel the same does it? Paul Tripp warns us that the everyday, boring, mundane details of our lives can tempt us to settle for something less than God's glory, by taking our focus away from God's kingdom and God's glory, and putting it on our own kingdoms.

I don't know if it affects y'all the same way, but when I watch these movies, or when I read stories like these, it creates this longing in my heart to be part of a story like this. I want to be part of something bigger than getting up, going to work, coming home, and going to sleep, so I can do it again tomorrow. You may feel the same way when you watch these movies. And the reality is that you and I were created to be part of a bigger story. We were created to live meaningful lives; but too many of us narrow the size of our lives down to our own happiness, to our own existence, and to our own little kingdom.

In this book, Tripp reminds us again and again that God's purpose for our lives is for us to transcend our self-oriented existence, and to be part of something bigger than just our own survival and our own little definition of happiness. In each of us, God has created a desire to live for more than ourselves. He's created us to be a part of His kingdom of glory.

And that's the focus of this book. Tripp answers the question, "How do we move from finding meaning and purpose, by being the kings of our own little limited kingdoms, to finding meaning and purpose as members of God's kingdom?" Paul Tripp says this in the first chapter of this book. He says, "The good news is that we were all created to be a part of something big, but the bad news is that most of us settle for being self-focused little kings ruling our own little kingdoms of one."

If you find yourself wondering about how your daily life fits into God's kingdom. If you find yourself wishing that your life was part of a bigger story than just the daily grind. If you wonder if God has a purpose for your life, then this book is for you. I have read this book numerous times, and I have always benefitted from the time that I've invested in it. If you've asked these questions before, or if you are simply looking for a good book to read as the summer months come to an end, I highly recommend this one.


