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THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Over the past few weeks our lives have been disrupted in ways that we could never have imagined. Our travel plans have been canceled. We're confining ourselves to our homes. Some of us have gone weeks without tasting Chick-fil-A for the first time in our lives. We're at home because our jobs have been deemed nonessential, or we're being asked to do our jobs in brand new ways. The entire sports world has come to a stop. Church buildings sit empty as pastors preach to congregations gathered around their computers, phones, and tablets. And we have sat in our homes and we have watched the news as this virus has spread around the world.

The truth is, that we do not know what to expect over the next several weeks. And as humans, when we don't know what to expect, our naturally tendency is to fear. But thankfully, God's Word meets us, even at our most fearful.

Psalm 23 says, "The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever."

In Psalm 23, David tells us that when the Lord is your shepherd you do not have to fear. And this is not because what you are

experiencing isn't scary. It's because the Lord is with us.

If you are watching the news and struggling with fear and anxiety. Let me encourage you to meditate on these words this month because knowing that the Lord is your shepherd changes how you face an uncertain tomorrow.

How does the reality that the Lord is our shepherd, change how we face tomorrow? I want to give us two ways. First, when you are confident that the Lord is your shepherd, you can stop trying to be your own shepherd.

You and I aren't qualified to be our own shepherds. And when we try to be, we are filled with fear and anxiety, because we don't actually have the power to provide for our own physical needs, we don't have the ability to know all things and to be able to lead ourselves down right paths, we aren't powerful enough to keep ourselves safe for harm, we aren't able to keep ourselves from being overwhelmed by the fear of harm, and we certainly have no control over the future. Psalm 23 tells us, that we can stop trying to be our own shepherds. We have a shepherd, who loves us, and who has all the power to take care of us. We can stop trying to be our own shepherd.

And then second, Psalm 23 tells us to place our trust in our good shepherd. One of the beautiful things about this Psalm is that in John 10 Jesus takes up the language of this Psalm and calls himself the good shepherd. In John 10:11-14 Jesus says, *"I am the good shepherd. The* good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep."

Jesus came and is our good shepherd, who laid down His life for His sheep. Our merciful and gracious Lord, who is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness, and who keeps steadfast love for thousands, who forgives iniquity and transgression and sin, but who tells us that by no means He would clear the guilty. Put our iniquity and our punishment upon His own Son. Jesus laid down His life for us so that all of us who like sheep have gone astray, can be forgiven for our sins and be reconciled to our good shepherd.

God has proven over and over again that our fearful hearts can rest, knowing that we really can trust Him to provide for us. Romans 8:32 says, "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?" God gave us His Son, the most precious thing that He could give us, to make a way for us to be forgiven. To provide us with a future where we can dwell in His house forever. To provide us with a confidence that we are His people, and that all His promises apply to us as well.

Sacred Roots Farm is a sustainable farm in Gainesville, GA, that provides long-term recovery for trafficked and sexually exploited women and their children. Here they experience safety and healing of mind, body and spirit, they discover and develop trust, and they find the hope that God has created for them.

Sav-A-Life in Tuscaloosa is a haven of hope for women who are experiencing an unplanned pregnancy. Here they can receive clinical services such as free pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, counseling options on adoption, information on abortion, parenting, sexual health, and post abortion healing through their Healing Hearts program. Many other programs and services are also offered.


