THE SESSION'S MESSAGE

On May 6th 2021, we will observe the National Day of Prayer. In 1775 the Continental Congress established a time for prayer while they were forming a new nation. Over the years there have been calls for a day of prayer. President Lincoln called for one in 1863. If ever we needed a day of prayer, it was in the middle of the civil war. On April 17, 1952 President Harry S. Truman signed a bill proclaiming the National Day of Prayer into Law. In 1988 President Ronald Reagan amended the law, designating the first Thursday in May of each year as the National Day of Prayer.

The National Prayer Committee was formed in 1972. They created a task force with the purpose of coordinating events for the National Day of Prayer. The President would issue a proclamation designating the first Thursday in May as a National Day of Prayer on which the people of the United States would go to God in prayer and meditation at churches and groups and as individuals praying for our country and its leaders.

All this was not without controversy. Many secular groups have taken issue with the concept of a day of prayer. Groups and individuals have worked to remove God from all parts of our government, stating the separation of Church and State. But the glue that holds our nation together is in fact the belief that there is a sovereign God and creator. People have been trying to supplant God and insert themselves in His place since the beginning. I happened to come across an article from the Freedom From Religion Foundation (FFRF). This is an excerpt from that article:

"Since 1989, the National Day of Prayer Task Force, housed in Focus on the Family's headquarters, has written presidential proclamations with a yearly theme and scripture verse. Presidents, governors and other public officials have often used the National Day of Prayer Task Force wording or themes. The evangelical Christian group exists to mobilize the Christian community to intercede for America and its leadership in the seven centers of power: Government, Military, Media, Business, Education, Church and Family. Its chairperson, Shirley Dobson, has spoken at eight White House prayer services on the National Day of Prayer. It organizes between 30,000 to 40,000 prayer gatherings across the country for that date, which was 'specifically limited to the Judeo-Christian heritage and those who share that conviction as expressed in the Lausanne Covenant (such as that the bible is the only written word of God, without error in all that it affirms" and that there is only one Savior and only one gospel)."

It would seem that the FFRF would be saying that we are not inclusive enough. I would say that as reformed Christians we are very inclusive, as long as you believe that the Bible is the word of God and is without error and that there is only one Savior and only one Gospel. Having said that I would only add that we will continue to pray for our country, our leaders, our military, our schools, and the lost who have not yet found saving grace in Jesus Christ.

To our friends:



Each of these holds memories that will never leave our minds.

So all Joyce and I can say is that we truly appreciate all the good experiences we have had at this church. The shift from 2-3 years to 42 years was possible because of you; because of this church.
