THE SESSION'S MESSAGE

<u>Matthew 24:3</u> "As he sat on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?"

All the disciples and countless generations of people have come and gone without seeing the end of the age, and yet, man still wants to know the answer to this question. Why would anyone want to know when the end of the world was coming? What would you do with that information? Would you change the way you live? Would you try to be a better person? Would you have one big party like those who do not believe in God.


Jesus did not give them a direct answer but spoke in generalities. He said many would come and say that they were the Christ, and they would lead countless people astray. There would be lawlessness and the love of many would grow cold. There would be wars and rumors of wars. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. The Gospel will be proclaimed throughout the world as a testimony to all nations and then the end will come.

God gave Moses the Ten Commandments to give to the people, which are simple instructions on how we are to live. The first four commandments deal with how we are to serve God, and the six that follow teach us how to deal with each other. Jesus boiled that down to two: "Love the Lord God with all your heart and soul and with all your mind and with all your strength." The second is like it, "Love your neighbor as yourself," which is often referred to as the golden rule (Luke 10:27).

I think it is a condition of the heart. Even if you remove all the guns from the world but do not change the heart, the problem will still be there. People will just simply find another way to kill each other.

So, when will the world end? And when is Jesus coming back? I don't know the answer to these questions other than to say that as Christians we are to be ready no matter when it happens. Let us not waste our time trying to predict when but live every day as if it were our last one on earth. We should love one another, and most importantly pray for each other. This is our connection to God. A connection that He made possible by sending His Son to pay for our sins.


