THE SESSION'S MESSAGE

Jude 1:3-4 "Dear friends, although I was very eager to write to you about the salvation we share, I felt compelled to write and urge you to contend for the faith that was once for all entrusted to God's holy people.

For certain individuals whose condemnation was written about long ago have secretly slipped in among you. They are ungodly people, who pervert the grace of our God into a license for immorality and deny Jesus Christ our only Sovereign and Lord."

Additionally, Ecclesiastes 1:9 said it quite well: "What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun."

People will twist the truth of the Bible and try to make it say what it does not say. God gave us his word so we would not change what is written but simply do what God has commanded us to do.

I am reminded of a conversation with a Secret Service Officer, and the discussion was about counterfeit money. How do you know for sure that a bill is counterfeit? The answer is that you study the real thing. When you know what a real twenty or 100 dollar bill looks and feels like, the fake bills are easy to detect. The same thing is true about the word of God. The word contend implies that Christians have something worth fighting for. We cannot afford to settle for an imitation and lose the real thing. Jude calls for Christians to persevere. He reminds them that Jesus predicted that in the end times there will be scoffers who will follow their own ungodly desires. Don't let yourselves to be taken in by their lies. Stay focused on God and stay in His Word.

To the only God who is able to keep us from falling, be all glory and honor, majesty and power, for all ages now and forevermore.


