THE SESSION'S MESSAGE

And my people, who bear my name, humble themselves, pray and seek my face, and turn from their evil ways, then I will hear from heaven, forgive their sin, and heal their land. 2 Chronicles 7:14

The strange paradox of humility is that when a man realizes he is humble, he then ceases to be so. Many seek to be humble so they can become great. This is self -deceit. Humility cannot be verified by the way a person acts or speaks, but only in the way he thinks and relates himself to God.

The apostle Paul almost brashly declared himself an example of what a Christian should be like, but he gave the true nature of humility when he confessed: "I am able to do all things through him who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13)

Humility is not the performing of a certain act, but the awareness of an omnipotent God. It is not the speaking of pious words, but the pulsation of a Spirit-filled life. Nor is it the false insistence of, "I am nothing!" It is the rousing declaration, "I am God's, and I find my strength in Him."

Jesus demonstrated by His life that one who seeks nothing for himself has true strength. To one who

makes no claims on life, the fullness and richness of life comes as a bountiful and undeserved gift. Making no attempt or pretense at strength and domination of others, he has the strength that comes from complete dependence on God.

Do not let pride get in the way of your relationship with God. The word proud comes from a word that means literally "one who shows himself above other people." An early Christian writer called pride "the citadel and summit of all evils." Scottish theologian William Barclay said that pride shuts itself off from God for three reasons: it does not know its own needs; it cherishes its own independence; and it does not recognize its own sin.

The humility that permits God's grace to abound in us is not a weak, shrinking thing. It is a humility filled with courage because it has opened the channel through which God's grace flows more and more.

We confess our sin and weakness, heavenly Father, and ask for Your forgiveness and strength.

Our prayer is that this money will be used to underwrite:


- A Denomination-wide Women's Bible Study Summer 2021
