THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

In January we noted that we are Bible people. The word of God is our only rule for faith and obedience. The Bible has numerous verses wherein it speaks of itself. For example, 2 Timothy 3: 16 "All Scripture is breathed out by God and is profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness." Or from another angle, Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart." Each of these statements come in the midst of a letter. The psalmist also spoke of God's word and how practical it is. "How can a young man keep his way pure? By guarding it according to your word" and "I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you" Psalm 119: 9 and 11.

One of my favorite subjects to teach is hermeneutics. That big word simply means the doctrine of interpretation. And the first thing we need to do to use God's word effectively and appropriately is to understand the various literary genres we find in the 66 books of the Bible. I love to ask what kinds of literature we find in the Bible and then to write them each on the board as students, young and old, answer. Well what do we have? Law. History. Prophecy. Poetry. Wisdom. Gospel. Narrative. Letters (Epistles). Apocalyptic literature. And others.

Let me ask a question and then I will briefly define each of these types of biblical literature. Do we take the Bible *literally*? Well, yes and no. R.C. Sproul put it like this: "The Bible should be interpreted according to its literal sense. ... To interpret the Bible literally is to interpret it as *literature*. That is, the natural meaning of a passage is to be interpreted according to the normal rules of grammar, speech, syntax, and context" (*Knowing Scripture*). We interpret a passage according to the kind of literature within which it is written."

Starting with the Old Testament, law has both a general and specific meaning. Specifically, God's laws are his commands that are expected to be obeyed by all people at all times. A proverb, on the other hand, is a general principle of how things *usually* work in the world created by God. Biblical history is truly history. But it is also told with a divine lesson and practical application in mind. It takes thinking and meditation to discern these sometimes. Biblical prophecy can mean at least two things. It may be predictive, as of the coming of the Messiah. But it also can be a word of instruction and admonition—God's people and the world had better listen!

As the old covenant gives way to the new, we have an entirely new genre of literature created: gospel. There are four, and only four, gospels. These are books that proclaim the good news of the birth of the anointed One, the Messiah, and the Lord Jesus Christ. The Acts of the Apostles tells us the history of the New Testament church and the coming of the Holy Spirit in his fullness. The New Testament is filled with epistles, that is, letters inspired by the Holy Spirit to be written to the church for instruction and edification. And we have the Revelation of John, apocalyptic literature, literature that is full of symbols that proclaim the return of Jesus to judge and rule forevermore. So the Bible is a book of books – THE Book of books. "Open my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of your law" Psalm 119:18.







FAITH PROMISE


The Faith Promise pledges will continue to be collected through the month of March. The submissions received will determine our church's giving to our Faith Promise missionaries for the year.


