THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Applying Ecclesiastes: Enjoying our Labor


Behold, what I have seen to be good and fitting is to eat and drink and find enjoyment in all the toil with which one toils under the sun the few days of his life that God has given him, for this is his lot. Everyone also to whom God has given wealth and possessions and power to enjoy them, and to accept his lot and rejoice in his toil this is the gift of God. (Ecclesiastes 5:18, 19 ESV)

August is past and September is upon us. My grandfather would talk about the dog days of August when the Alabama heat and humidity seemed unbearable. The *Old Farmer's Almanac* lists the Dog Days of Summer from July 3rd to August 11th when sweltering weather coincides with the morning rising of Sirius, the Dog Star. This heat has certainly zapped our strength this past month. But now summer is basically behind us and school has started. We all have work to do. But most of us do get the first Monday of September off for Labor Day. It became a federal holiday in 1894. I encourage you to enjoy that day! But as we do we can also meditate on our labors.

Remember, God's call for us to work came in Genesis 1-2 before the Fall in Genesis 3. Work is a good thing. It is not just a job or an occupation, but a calling, a vocation. But it is hard. It is tiring. It is labor. And we often toil under the sun without seeing the results we long to see. So what do we do?

We take Solomon's wisdom to heart. God is not a spoilsport. He intends us to enjoy the benefits of our work as a reward for our labor. Even in this world that has been broken by the Fall, God gives us the ability to find joy and satisfaction in our work. It comes from him. It is a gift of grace. It is a means for us to glorify and enjoy God. Meditating on this can really encourage us as we work. Among the many contributions of Martin Luther (1483-1546) was his focus on the doctrine of vocation. He wanted all those in his flock to do their work as a holy calling. He is famous for his insistence that the work of the homemaker, cobbler, farmer, or blacksmith is just as valuable as that of the priest. Because we are saved by grace through faith, we are free to serve God and others with authentic joy as we work.

In his inimitable way he put it like this:



Friends, whatever your particular calling at any given time-parent, grandparent, Sunday School teacher, mechanic, accountant, farmer, business executive (you get the idea!)-let's do our work with a view to loving God with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength and loving our neighbors as ourselves. And may God's grace go before us as we do.




New Tuesday Women's Ministry Circle Study:


