THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Love of Jesus

Love is patient, love is kind. Love does not envy, is not boastful, is not arrogant, is not rude, is not self-seeking, is not irritable, and does not keep a record of wrongs. Love finds no joy in unrighteousness but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. (1 Corinthians 13:4-7 CSB)

If I am not mistaken, I believe that love will be getting a lot of press this month. Heart-shaped candy has been on display since Christmas! A wonderful book by Dr. Phil Ryken was published in 2012 called *Loving the Way Jesus Loves*. He had preached a series of sermons from 1 Corinthians 13 looking at them through the lens of Jesus as the Scriptures present him. He changed my paradigm for thinking about that famous text. Jesus really does exemplify those characterics of love.

Let's consider a few examples from the gospels. Love is patient. Can you imagine what life was like for Jesus and his inner circle of Peter, James, and John? And can you even conceive of the patience Jesus showed these men he called? Peter rebuked Jesus when our Lord made clear his plan to go to the cross. Peter came out with his sword swinging in the Garden of Gethsemane. Later that night he denied Jesus three times. James and John once volunteered to Jesus that they would call down fire from heaven to consume some unbelieving Samaritans. Later their own mother asked Jesus to place her sons on his right and his left in his kingdom. Jesus was patient. He told Peter beforehand that he had prayed for him. After the resurrection he gave Peter three opportunities to renew his love for Christ according to those three denials. As far as James and John (and their mother!) go, he loved them to the end. The patience of Jesus as well as his lack of rudeness and lack of irritability are a wonder to behold.

Love is kind. When he ministered to lepers, he touched them. He also touched the bier upon which lay the deceased son of the widow of Nain. Once a woman with a flow of blood touched the garment of Jesus. All of

these instances would have made Jesus unclean. That means he would have been ceremonially unfit to attend worship in the temple. Jesus is kind. Quite beyond the healings in all these stories is the pure kindness of Jesus entering—physically and spiritually—the lives of those he touched (pun intended!).

Love ... does not keep a record of wrongs. Think of the two encounters in John's gospel Jesus had with the Samaritan woman at the well and the woman caught in adultery. The first was five times divorced and living with a man not her husband. The second was caught in the very act of adultery. The end of each story? Repentance and faith. Grace and forgiveness. And witness to the truth. And the admonition: "Neither do I condemn you," said Jesus. "Go, and from now on do not sin anymore."

What wondrous love is this! It finally would *endure* and *bear* the cross for sinners like us.




Can you knit or crochet?
