# THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

### The Savior We Need Has Come

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John. As soon as he came up out of the water, he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well-pleased." Immediately the Spirit drove him into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and the angels were serving him. (Mark 1:9-13 CSB)

Jesus submitted to baptism by John the Baptist. We learn from Matthew that John did not want to baptize Jesus but thought that Jesus should baptize him! Jesus said that he must be baptized to fulfill all righteousness. The spotless Lamb of God was baptized with a baptism symbolizing repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Why? He was identifying with his people in every way. Jesus was the second Adam. He was representing all those who would trust in him and receive his finished work on their behalf. As the one who would bear the sins of the world in the place of his people, he received the sign and seal of baptism. Heaven was watching as the long awaited Messiah's ministry was being inaugurated. The Holy Spirit testified, coming down from heaven and resting upon him. This reminds us of the dove that was sent out from Noah's ark and found rest upon the newly washed earth. Likewise, in Christ a new spiritual beginning had arrived.

Next the Father spoke his audible words of blessing. "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well-pleased." Abraham had once heard a voice from heaven when he had been willing to sacrifice his own beloved son. But God provided a substitute, a ram, instead of his son. But here we have our Father's beloved Son who would be tempted by Satan, would preach and heal, and would be delivered up for our sins, receiving a baptism of blood upon the cross. Jesus identified with us in every way.

The Spirit descended upon Jesus like a dove and then *immediately* (one of Mark's favorite words) *drove him into the wilderness*. He was there for forty days, the number forty relating his work to many Old Testament figures such as Noah, Moses, and Elijah. The final Prophet had arrived on the scene!

Matthew and Luke tell us some of the specific temptations Jesus underwent before Satan. In each case Jesus answered the Deceiver by quoting from Deuteronomy 6 and 8. Jesus' responses demonstrate our greatest need is nourishment from the word of God (Matt. 4:1-4; cf. Joshua 1:8), our primary obedience is to submit to God (Mt. 4:5-7; cf. 1 Sam. 15:22-24), and our ultimate calling is to worship God (Mt. 4:8-10; cf. Exo. 20:1-8). God's word is a lamp unto my feet, a light unto my path, and a weapon against sin.

He was with the wild animals. Only Mark adds this detail. Why? There is a theological reason. Adam failed his test in a garden—and the world has not been the same since. Jesus passed his test in the wilderness and in the midst of the fallen and sin-cursed world as Adam had left it. I also think a practical reason for this detail was Mark's source and original audience. Peter was undoubtedly Mark's primary witness in telling his story. Peter knew that Christians in Rome under the reign of Nero had stood helpless before wild beasts in the arena. But even Nero could throw nothing at them that was alien to the experience of their Savior.

Let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. (Hebrews 4:14b-16)


