## **THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

#### Meditating on the Word of God

King David the psalmist said, "The law of the LORD is perfect, reviving the soul; ...the rules of the LORD are true, ...sweeter also than honey" (see Psalm 19:7-14 ESV). Another Spiritfilled poet composed an extensive acrostic poem of prayer expanding and applying David's insights. Psalm 119 is made up of 176 verses. These odes to the word of God are made up of eight couplets devoted to each letter of the Hebrew alphabet in turn. A devotional treasure.

I have grown to appreciate this monumental meditation on the word of God as I have gotten older. I wish I had appreciated it sooner. J. Alec Motyer wrote of the writer and his work, "It was the psalmist's privilege to celebrate the fundamental reality that the word of God is central to the life of God's people. Our God is a God who speaks and it is the possession of that verbal revelation which marks his people off from all others on earth."

Psalm 119 speaks of the *word* of the Lord, his *commands*, *precepts*, *promises*, *decrees*, and *laws*, among other words for God's revelation to us. The late Motyer instructs us that these various English words are translated from a variety of Hebrew words. They tell us different aspects and emphases of God's word: it is divine speech (*word*); it expresses the mind of God (*laws*, *statutes*); his word is enduring—it is perpetually valid (*decrees*); it is a perfect combination of authority and love (*law*); and the word of God is designed for practical application to life (*commands*, *commandments*, *precepts*, *ways*).

Each time I read and meditate on this psalm I am attracted to new thoughts and concepts beyond the verses we all seem to remember from VBS and Sunday School (verses 9, 11, and 105, for example). Consider praying over and thinking through the ones below (and discover your own) that especially describe the benefits we receive from God's words to us.

I will praise you with an upright heart, when I learn your righteous rules (v. 7).

In the way of your testimonies I delight as much as in all riches (14).

*My soul melts away for sorrow; strengthen me according to your word* (28).

This is my comfort in my affliction, that your promise gives me life (50).

Your statutes have been my songs in the house of my sojourning (54).

*I am a companion of all who fear you, of those who keep your precepts* (63).

Those who fear you shall see me and rejoice, because I have hoped in your word (74).

*If your law had not been my delight, I would have perished in my affliction* (92 (see 67, 71)).

Your commandment makes me wiser than my enemies, for it is ever with me (98).

The unfolding of your words gives light; it imparts understanding to the simple (130).

*My eyes shed streams of tears, because people do not keep your law* (136).

Through God's word we become established in praise. We learn the joy of the Lord over against coveting the goods of the world. We are able to keep going even in grief and to have hope in the face of troubles. God's word provides a soundtrack in the midst of loneliness. God's rules help me find my true friends in this life. Believers will be encouraged as they see the fruit of God's word in my life. Knowing God's prescription saves us and sustains us through the hardest of times. God's law written on the heart will preserve you in these treacherous days of rebellion not only against God but against nature. The word of God likewise gives us courage for our battles with the world, the flesh, and the wiles of the devil. Finally, with the convicting, convincing, and converting power of the Holy Spirit at work within us, we, like Jesus, are filled with compassion for the lost people in this world. We see they are indeed like sheep without a shepherd.

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer (19:14). Amen. **MARCH 2024**


