The Resurrection

I believe in Jesus Christ...who was crucified, dead, and buried...on the third day he rose again from the dead.

Our faith as Christians is built upon historical events and persons. The gospels, Acts, and the epistles provide theological interpretation of these events as well as reporting them. This helps us understand our salvation. But the good news is often recounted by a simple recitation of the redemptive events themselves.

1 Corinthians 15 is rich in this respect concerning the life of Jesus Christ.

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand,...

³ For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶ Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep.

Further, the apostle is dead earnest in his explanation of the resurrection of Christ.

¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised. ¹⁷ And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins.

Without the resurrection we remain dead in sin and destined for hell.

However, he continues,

²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. ²⁴ Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power.

These facts of history mean everything to us and our salvation.

Though the infamous "they" have changed *Before Christ* (BC) to *Before the Common Era* (BCE), there is still no hiding from the birth of Jesus of Nazareth as the hinge point of our calendar. Likewise, the resurrection of Jesus Christ is the hinge point of reality as we know it. The resurrection matters.

Jesus our Lord "was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification" (Rom. 4:25). Jesus rose from the dead so that the

believer could be justified, that is, made right—declared righteous—before God.

Paul writes of God, "according to the working of his great might that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places" (Eph. 1:19b-20). Jesus rose from the grave that he might ascend to his rightful place of authority above all things forever. Jesus is King of kings.

"And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent" (Col. 3:18). Jesus rose from the dead that we might rise with him in due time. He rose to take his rightful position as head of the church. All things are ultimately from him and through him and to him.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Pet. 1:3). Jesus lives again so that we might not only receive new life *in* him, but the hope of eternity *with* him.

But every human being on this planet must take heed. "The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead" (Acts 17:30-31). The resurrection of Jesus Christ provides the certainty that he will judge the living and the dead in righteousness, justice, and holiness. If you have not done so, call on Jesus alone and be saved! (See Mark 1:15; Acts 4:12; & Romans 10:10-13.)




